- **If you didn't see the notice of remote learning in last week's parent update, I have listed below again.**

- Participation in district remote and blended learning platforms, including in-person and virtual lessons, indicates your consent for your child to be recorded in classroom lessons and instructional sessions for the sole purpose of accessibility of the lesson and its contents to all students in the course or assigned class. At minimum, names and images will be recorded. It is also possible that your child's class participation and involvement in classroom disciplinary situations could be shown or heard on the recording. It will not be feasible for the school to edit recordings before they are made available to other students for viewing. Parents who wish to opt their child out of remote learning recordings must submit written notice via email to the school Principal. Opting out of the consent to record may result in limited access to or exclusion from "real time" remote learning opportunities.
